The Leon Choral Department upholds a proud tradition of excellence, and we are delighted you have chosen to become part of our musical family. Our goal is to provide quality music education to every student at Leon. Please read this handbook and ask your parent/guardian to read it carefully. ABOUT OUR CHORAL PROGRAM

The Leon Choral Program has been in existence since the 1920-1921 school year.
We have SIX curricular choir classes and two co-curricular choral ensembles. Descriptions at www.leonchorus.com

The following curricular choirs are non-auditioned – anyone can join!

Prelude: non-auditioned, for treble voices who have not yet had chorus at the high school level

Overture: non-auditioned, for tenor/bass voices

Opus: 10th-12th grade treble voices who have had at least one year of high school chorus

The following curricular choir classes are placed by audition only:

Madrigal Singers: 11th and 12th grade SATB chamber choir (also enrolled in Capital Singers)

Melodears: 11th and 12th grade SSAA chamber choir (also enrolled in Capital Singers)

Capital Singers: 11th and 12th grade SATB large choir; Leon's Top Choir (10th grade TB)

Our co-curricular ensemble perform in lunchtime concerts, community events, and Pops

Mane Event: ~Auditioned~9th through 12th grade SATB ensemble, meets Thursdays from 7:00-8:30pm

CLASSROOM POLICIES

Classroom Rules:

1. Be kind and respectful to your classmates and director(s).
2. Do not disrupt rehearsal (verbally, physically, via electronics, food, headphone/airpods, makeup, hair, moving about the room, etc)
3. Participate to the best of your ability, making eye contact with the director during the rehearsal. We expect cell phones are put away the whole period.

*More than half of your grade is based on the **quality** of your participation in class. Good quality participation = Eye contact with director, having only choral materials & pencil with you, and singing with proper technique!

Classroom Procedures:

1. All classroom doors will remain locked at all times for safety. They can always be safely exited.
2. Be in your assigned seat with music folder, & pencil in hand by the tardy bell.
3. Water bottles/choral materials only at your seat. (No gum. No food.)
4. We will warm up physically and vocally to be ready to sing!
5. You may use the music/science building bathroom **after warm ups**. The class bathroom pass is required, and you leave your phone on the piano to go. Frequent/extended periods of use of the bathroom during class time will be addressed with the individual and parents.

Absences/Tardies:

The seats in the chorus room are numbered and assigned. Empty chair = absence. Roll is not called by name. Student officers may check the seating chart, but are not permitted to enter attendance on the online portal. Persons not seated with their folder in their assigned seat by the time the tardy bell rings will be marked absent.

Discipline Procedure:

We do not expect discipline problems in our chorus classroom. If needed, our procedure is outlined below.

1. First offense – verbal redirection
2. Second offense - Contact with parent/guardian to discuss the behavior and how it can be managed
3. Third offense – Referral written and second parent/guardian contact made

*Serious offenses may warrant an immediate referral.

We understand we have incredible humans in our room and this is rarely needed!

COMMUNICATION

We try very hard to make sure everyone (including parents) are aware of our expectations and our concert dates. Please make sure your contact info is correct in FOCUS. You can also follow @Leon_Chorus on Instagram or Leon Friends of Music on Facebook!

CONCERT ATTENDANCE POLICY

Please note: Madrigals and Melodears are frequently asked to perform in addition to our set school performance season, especially around the holiday season. At least 3 weeks notice (for asking off work, etc) is given, and each member is expected to be at each performance

All members are expected and required to attend all rehearsals and performances. Because chorus is a performance-based class, rehearsals and performances are an integral part of the curriculum, and of the overall success of the program. No one is “on the bench” in chorus!

Absences not requested with sufficient notice will automatically be marked unexcused. There are exceptions in situations of extreme emergency or sudden illness. It is understood that in these situations, a Remind message will be sent to Mrs. Peck or Mrs. Smith before the event occurs. A “no call no show” is a 0. We can help make accommodations for rides, etc. to our performances if we know in advance!

For EXCUSED absences:

Students who miss a performance for any excused reason may do the makeup assignment for **90%** of the performance grade.

EXCUSED absences from performance include but are not limited to:

- LEON sporting game, prearranged with Peck/Smith to be at the game rather than concert.
- Extreme illness
- Death in the family
- Other LEON performance

For UNEXCUSED absences:

Students who miss a performance for any unexcused reason may do the makeup assignment for **65%** of the performance grade.

UNEXCUSED absences from a performance include but are not limited to:

- Lack of transportation
- Student/Parent had to work
- Forgetfulness
- Social Activities (birthdays, etc)
- Other non-Leon performance/activity

UNIFORM AND FEE INFORMATION

The annual cost of running a modern-day choral program is in excess of \$25,000 per year. Because of this number, we charge for admission to our concerts (\$5) and we do expect all students in choir to pay a choir fee. Fees are due September 18th.

FEES can be paid online via eFunds! Visit www.leonchorus.com for the link!

Prelude (2nd period)/Overture (3rd period): \$65

Your fee covers: a chorus t-shirt, tie OR scarf, a workbook, Treble/Tenor Bass Day Registration, and MPA that we attend in the spring (busses and registration and pizza). Prelude will need to provide floor length black dress pants or skirt (no leggings please), and a black blouse with sleeves for their uniform, Overture needs to provide a white button up long sleeve shirt and black pants.

Opus (5th period): \$75

Your fee covers: An Opus t-shirt, rental of your chorus dress, a workbook for class, Treble Day Registration, and MPA that we attend in the spring (busses and registration and pizza.)

Capital Singers (4th period) \$150 (Madrigals (6th) and Melodears (7th) are an additional \$50)

Your fee covers: Dress or Tuxedo rental for the year, your Capital Singers polo, rental of Mads/Melos separate uniform pieces, Treble/Tenor Bass Day Registration, a workbook for class, MPA, and trophies/awards we give at the end of the year.

At no time will a student be denied participation in our activities due to financial strain. There is a financial assistance form on p.5. We have a payment plan/partial scholarship application available!

PRIVATE VOICE LESSONS

Private voice lessons are a wonderful way to become more comfortable with singing, in a solo or choral context. Voice students work on separate repertoire, range development, maintaining vocal health, as well as expressive elements. There are a number of quality voice teachers in town that we would be happy to recommend to you (they have their own studios.)

Leon Chorus also contracts through LCSB with professional voice teachers who teach after school hours. Lessons must be paid for in advance for the semester. 10 lessons=\$200.00.
